#### **Carlton Cannon, Jr.: Gospel, Jazz, R&B**

Carlton Cannon Jr. is a man steeped in music. The eldest son of retired U. S. Marine Corps officer, Carlton Cannon Sr. and Lettie Cannon, he was nourished in Japan for twelve years. He developed a rich appreciation for integrity, honor, discipline and respect for international culture. Gospel, jazz, blues, funk, R&B, classical and world music are all genres of music that he has been involved with. The current Director of Bands at the Cab Calloway School of the Arts in Wilmington, he utilizes his performance skills on alto, tenor, and soprano saxophones, clarinet, flute and various percussion instruments. Dr. Cannon holds a BA in Instrumental Music Education from DSU and a EdD from Wilmington University. Dr. Cannon studied at the Jazzmobile in Harlem, NYC under the guidance of Frank Foster, Charles Davis, and the late Grover Washington Jr. His group, the Jabari Jazz ensemble, has been featured at such events as First Night Wilmington, First Night Dover, the Grand Opera House and recently released a CD, *Gospazz*, paying homage to his gospel and jazz roots. He has recorded a CD entitled *Are You Ready* with his worship group, The Purity of Worship Experience. As a performing musician, he has worked with many well known talents including Chaka Khan, Bill Cosby, and Donald Byrd & the Blackbyrds. He has served as the VP of the Int'l Assoc. of Jazz Educators, on the board of the DE Charitable Music Inc., and currently serves on the board of the American Federation of Musicians, Local 21, Wilmington.

#### **Hidden Figures**

It's the start of the Space Program and you work at NASA where the glass ceiling is especially low, lower still if you're a woman of color. Until the film *Hidden Figures*, few knew the space race was so deeply entwined with the fight for racial freedom. Come along for the fast-moving but long-unknown story of three talented friends who made vital contributions to our space program (helping to get John Glenn into orbit and safely home) while at the same time battling prejudice so deeply ingrained in Virginia culture that every day was a fight to maintain their dignity, not to mention moving ahead in their careers. Let *People Magazine* explain the appeal of this Oscar-nominated movie: "Taraji P. Henson, Octavia Spencer and Janelle Monáe bring every ounce of their considerable charm to a script filled with humor and heart." There's plenty of tension too, along with cringe-inducing affronts to the trio's personal dignity. These women have worked hard all their lives, within the system and getting around it, all the time maintaining their senses of humor and persevering. Their interwoven

## *Summer of Science & Tech*

The Dover Public Library is one of 42 public libraries across the US which will host one of three traveling exhibits. For Dover, it is our Summer of Science & Tech as we kick off our summer reading program for all ages with the opening of the *Explore Tech: Engineers Make a World of Difference* exhibit on Saturday, June 10.

*Explore Tech: Engineers Make a World of Difference* shows how engineering provides solutions to better meet human needs and develops sustainable innovations for the future. It features hands-on and multimedia components that allow exhibit visitors to interact with content in a dynamic way, encouraging new perspectives about engineers and their vital work.

The exhibition is offered by the American Library Association (ALA) Public Programs Office in collaboration with the Space Science Institute's *National Center for Interactive Learning* (NCIL), the Lunar and Planetary Institute and the Afterschool Alliance. NCIL is the lead organization for this project. *The Explore* exhibitions are made possible through the support of the National Science Foundation. The exhibition and its educational support materials and outreach opportunities are part of the STAR (Science-Technology Activities and Resources) Library Education Network (*STAR\_Net*), a hands-on learning program for libraries and their communities developed by the *National Center for Interactive Learning* at the Space Science Institute.

The Summer of Science & Tech also features the annual STEM Makerfest and a series of workshops and experiences for teachers, librarians and the public leading up to the Total Solar Eclipse on August 21, 2017.
